On **18 January 2018**, the Committee **renewed the listing** and **enacted the amendments** specified with strikethrough and underline in the entry below on its List of individuals and entities subject to the assets freeze, travel ban and other measures relating to attempts to illicitly export petroleum, including crude oil and refined petroleum products, from Libya (the Libya Sanctions List), set out in paragraphs 15 and/or 17 of Security Council resolution 1970 (2011) and/or paragraph 19 of resolution 1973 (2011), or paragraph 10 of resolution 2146 (2014) as extended and modified by paragraph 2 of resolution 2362 (2017), adopted under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations:

### **Reason for listing:**

The vessel Capricorn (IMO: 8900878) was listed on 21 July 2017, pursuant to paragraphs 10 (a) and 10 (b) of resolution 2146 (2014), as extended and modified by paragraph 2 of resolution 2362 (2017), as transporting gasoil, a refined petroleum product, illicitly exported from Libya, based on information received from the Government of Libya.

### **Additional information:**

Pursuant to paragraph 11 of resolution 2146 (2014), this designation was renewed by the Committee on ~~20 October 2017~~ 18 January 2018 and is valid until ~~18 January 2018~~ 17 April 2018, unless terminated earlier by the Committee pursuant to paragraph 12 of resolution 2146 (2014).
